Prince Edward County is located in south-central Virginia in the Piedmont Plateau. Prince Edward is bordered by Amelia County and Nottoway County to the east, Appomattox County to the west, Buckingham County and Cumberland County to the north, and Charlotte County and Lunenburg County to the south. COUNTY GOVERNMENT



PARKS AND RECREATION

Prince Edward County values residents' quality of life. Prince Edward County encompasses a variety of recreation sites, facilities, and waterways. Prince Edward County outdoor life consists of four waterways (Wilck's Lake, Briery Creek Lake, Sandy River Reservoir, and the Appomattox River), three State Parks (High Bridge Trail State Park, Twin Lakes State Park, and Sailor's Creek Battlefield State Park), and one State Forest (Prince Edward Gallion State Forest). Briery Creek (3,164 acres) and Featherfin (2,800 acres) are the two wildlife management areas located in Prince Edward County. Sandy Golf Course, and Outdoor Adventure Park, Manor Southside Virginia Family YMCA are other contributions to the recreational life in Prince Edward County.
