




ABOUT PRINCE EDWARD COUNTY

Prince Edward County is centrally located between Roanoke and Lynchburg to the west, Charlottesville to the north, and Richmond to the northeast, with primary access provided by Routes 15, 360, and 460. Originally formed in 1754 from Amelia County, Prince Edward County was named for Prince Edward, second son of Frederick, Prince of Wales.

The County's history is rich and complex, marked by significant Civil War battles, a student-led civil rights movement, and challenges during the early days of desegregation. Agriculture and higher education, anchored by the continuous operation of Hampden-Sydney College since 1775 and Longwood University since 1839, form the backbone of the County's economy. However, the community faces common rural challenges, including population decreases, affordable housing shortages, inflation, and a lack of living wage jobs. County demographic data reveals disparities compared to state averages, highlighting the need for improvement in poverty rates, household income, education levels, and public health indicators.

Today's challenges will be met with the dedication to make tomorrow bright for all of our residents, businesses, and community organizations. To achieve this goal, today's assets and challenges must be understood with a clear vision and a plan to move forward. Several important questions guide Prince Edward County as we make our way forward. How do we provide for and prepare our children and youth to thrive and achieve their goals? How do we provide for our adult population so that they can learn new skills, gain better employment, improve their health and literacy, and thrive here in Prince Edward? How do we attract professionals and families to live in and serve our community as the next generation of long-term residents? This Plan, PEC2045: Forward Together, provides the roadmap to answer these questions.


Map 2.1 | Regional Context Map




GEOGRAPHY AND LOCATION


Prince Edward County is 354 square miles in area with an average density of 62 people per square mile. Centrally located in the heart of Virginia, Prince Edward County is 50 miles southeast of Lynchburg, 68 miles south of Charlottesville, 72 miles southwest of Richmond, and 146 miles northwest of Norfolk.






